
Preschool 345 Newsletter December 2017

Collection for Operation Orphan 'Keep a Child Warm' project

At the Christmas Fair we will be collecting donations for the above project which supports children living in Eastern Europe (and beyond) where they face harsh winter conditions. If you feel able to give then please do and help spread the Christmas love!

The goal is to provide as many children as possible with adequate clothing and relevant support to withstand and survive the low temperatures. More information can be found on the charity website http://www.operation-orphan.org/projects/europe/eastern-central-europe/

The children supported are generally over the age of 3 and up to 19/20 so they can take sizes 2-3yrs+ and up to small adult. The items should be GOOD QUALITY and items need are:

- Warm winter coats
- Thick jumpers
- Thick cosy trousers
- Thick socks
- Hats, scarves, gloves and blankets (the blankets need to be around 6x4ft in size as this is the most versatile and they like to be able to make sure each child receives a similar sized blanket).

Remembrance Day

The children have been busy, working together to make a poppy wreath to place at the memorial cross.

On Friday 10th November we took all the children over to the memorial cross to lay our poppy wreath where we all stood very quietly while we thought about all the people we love and all the people who have died.



Behaviour Advice

December can be a very exciting time with so many different activities and events happening. Even if you don't celebrate Christmas the shops are decorated, more treats on are sale everything is lit up. Children can be very excited even if they don't entirely know why!

With extra fun there can also be extra excitement and then extra tiredness, (from the children as well as the grownups)

Sometimes it is good to keep to a routine of some sorts whilst also being 'busy' with Christmas.

Here are a few Christmas type activities to keep your little ones entertained and occupied during December which also link to the Early Years Foundation Stage. Although there could be some mess later to clear up but obviously little ones are good at tidying up. 🖨

Making Christmas cards, drawing pictures and writing their name.

<u>Exploring and using media and materials</u>: understands that they can use lines to enclose a space and use these shapes to represent objects.

Writing: writes own name.

Cutting out pictures from a catalogue and gluing them onto a piece of paper to make a Christmas list of what they would like or what they would like to buy for other people.

Moving and handling: uses tools safely and appropriately.

Baking which includes lots of mathematics and is, hopefully, also good to eat.


Shape, space and measure: orders items by weight

People and communities: Enjoys joining in with family custom and routines

Throughout your child's early years they are learning critical language and communication skills, by listening to stories your child is reinforcing the basic sounds that form language and also the rhythm of language.

'Pretend reading' when your child pages through a book babbling and talking about the pictures is a very important pre-literacy activity.

"Read it again"

Some children love to look at and listen to the same book over and over again, the repetition and familiarity helps your child learn new words and remember important words and sentences, they will soon be 'Pretend reading' you the story.
