Water Channelling Unit – a whole lot of wet water and funnels, kiddie delight ⓒ



### Mandys Bit ..

**There are lots of things you can do** to encourage and support your child's communication, speech and language.

For younger children, Adding words to your child's sentences can show them how words fit together e.g. If your child says "red car" you can say "big red car".

- Tell stories more than once repetition helps children understand and remember words. For older children, Join your child in pretend play let them take the lead, reversing roles can be great fun, let them be mummy/daddy this helps them talk about new situations and helps their language and creativity.
- Talk about what they are saying and doing rather than asking lots of questions, this helps their language skills and shows you are listening and interested.

A fun activity to develop listening skills is to sit quietly in the garden or out on walks in the park and listen to the sounds they hear and talk about what they heard after.

Most importantly HAVE FUN!!!

How to contain the germs!

Encourage your child to cover their mouth when they cough or sneeze and if they have used a tissue, put it in the bin. Regular hand washing with soap and water for children and adults is the most effective way to prevent germs spreading.

## Your committee needs you!

## **Custard creams** – from the blog 'Baking with granny'.

These are very easy (and very delicious!).
Kids will love to help you make them!

#### Method

- 1. Pre-heat your oven to 180°c (160°c for fan assisted ovens or Gas Mark 4) and put greaseproof paper on a couple of baking sheets
- 2. In a large bowl cream the butter & icing sugar until light and fluffy.
- 3. Gradually add the flour & custard powder a little at a time until the mixture forms a paste.
- 4. Divide into small balls (about a teaspoon-tablespoon per biscuit) and place onto your pre-greased baking tray with a bit of space between. Flatten each ball lightly with a fork.
- 5. Bake for 12-15 minutes until they appear dry on top.
- 6. Allow to cool on a wire rack.
- 7. Mix the butter & icing sugar to form the butter cream and once the biscuits are completely cool, pipe or spread a little butter cream onto half the biscuits and sandwich together with the other halves.

**Biscuits** 

70g Butter (at room temperature) 55g Icing Sugar 170g Self-raising Flour 55g Custard Powder

Filling

50g Butter (at room temperature) 100g Icing Sugar
